



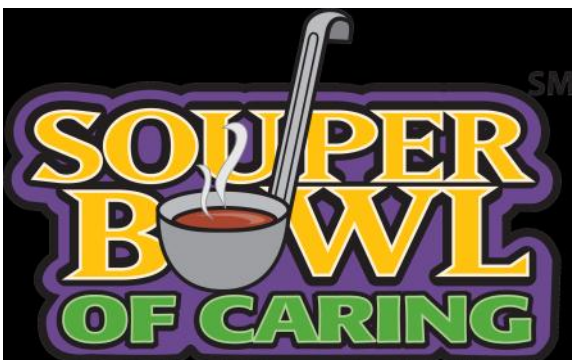

Pastor's Note - Rev. Dana Hamilton

One of the most difficult things for human beings is trust in someone else besides us. And then along comes God and asks us to relinquish control? But unless we do just that we will forever be disappointed in the results of our efforts. During the month of January we have been looking at our X-Factor, our Christ Factor, during our time together in worship. One of the most important things I have gleaned from my readings this month has been that loving and serving God is an adventure. It is an adventure in Trust.

I lost a very dear friend in January. She was young, 61 and a mother of children younger than mine. She was a grandmother, a wife, a sister, and a friend. I prayed for her strength and courage as she faced life in a cancer ravaged body. The Psalmist tells us to "Be still and know that I am God." In more modern words, "Let go, and recognize that I am God." Being still and letting go are difficult for us. Yet, we often pray as if we believe God can and will do something about our situations.

The greatest Adventure we have in our time here on this earth is to believe and know in the very depths of our being that God is on our side no matter what! Know and trust that when you ask God in prayer for anything it has already been set in motion. Jeremiah tells us that *God knows the plans He has for us and those plans are for good and not harm*. So in these next few weeks as we move toward Lent, a time of deep reflection upon our relationship with God, take time to say "Thank you God" for all that has gone on in your life because God really does have the upper hand.

This mind-set of thankfulness will bring about a much more positive outlook on the situation and your/our whole daily walk through life. Thankful prayers keep our focus on God's presence and promises and not on ourselves and our wants. Join me in this adventure of trust - it has the potential to change our lives. See you Sunday.

Jimmy LaFave was born in Wills Point, Texas, a small town 30 miles east of Dallas. He began school down the road in Mesquite and by Junior High was making music perched behind his Sears & Roebuck drum kit. It wasn't long before his mother traded a drawer full of green stamps for his first guitar and the switch to singer-songwriter was in progress. His family later moved to Stillwater, Oklahoma, where he finished high school. Although he has lived in Austin for over 20 years, many people think of him as being from Oklahoma, because of his strong musical ties to the state and what he often refers to as its "red dirt music." It was in this landscape that he began to define his sound and soak up a combination of his experiences among authentic songwriters from the tradition of Woody Guthrie. So Far in 2012...

The phone volunteers kicked off the year with a great resource meeting that included volunteers and staff from Helping Hands in Dripping Springs, St. Vincent de Paul Society of St Mary's Catholic Church, and Cypress Creek Church. The meeting featured Julian Huerta of Foundation Communities of Austin. Foundation Communities (FC) is a local non-profit providing first class, affordable homes and support services for thousands of low-income families and individuals, empowering them with the tools they need to succeed. FC owns and operates 16 properties in Austin and North Texas providing affordable homes to over 2,500 families, creates enriched learning environments for over 700 children as well as ongoing adult education and financial coaching, and helps over 18,000 low income residents file their taxes free of charge every year. <http://www.foundcom.org/>

The Barnabas Connection is a community outreach of the Wimberley United Methodist Church, provided primarily through a telephone referral service. Volunteers provide information and assistance on a variety of needs. Resources are available for much of Hays County. Call 847-1664 for assistance.

Youth Fellowship

During Jesus earthly ministry, he had twelve core disciples. Of the twelve disciples, he had three that he was particularly close with (James, John, & Peter). These twelve disciples soon became apostles when they were *sent* out into the world to make more disciples. Apostle means *sent*. These twelve disciples went out into the world spreading the good news of Jesus Christ. From these twelve men, thousands would come to Christ as the early Christian movement began. That movement is still growing today.

We recently began our new High School youth ministry on Sunday nights, splitting off our High School kids from our Jr. High kids to give each group more focus and age appropriate content. We had six high school kids show up, and three of them were first timers. We talked and I told them my hope and desire for our time together, then I simply asked them what they wanted to do for the time that we have. They shared ideas that we could discuss, fun things we could do, spiritual matters we could look at, and we joked and laughed and had a good time. I'm told that several of them are now inviting their friends to come.

I have a youth director friend in San Marcos who told me that when she started she had just a handful of kids coming. Soon, as she identified some of the leaders and plugged into them, they started inviting their friends. That handful of kids has turned into over forty kids on any given youth group gathering. It wasn't forced, it was organic.

Please pray for our high school group as we continue to gather. Pray God grows the group in depth, and if possible in numbers. Pray for all of our youth to become committed disciples of Jesus Christ.

On **February 17-19** we are going to be taking the High School kids on a mid-winter retreat to Leakey, TX. The cost is \$110 and we have many kids interested in going who could use scholarship money. If you feel compelled to, please consider donating to this cause. This will be a great opportunity for the youth to be poured into, challenged, refreshed, and grow a deeper sense of commitment to our church community.

Also this month, Wimberley UMC youth will be leading both services on February 5th, Super Bowl Sunday. We will be taking up a special offering to give to our local food pantry, Crisis Bread Basket, as well as collecting canned goods for this cause.

Peter says, "You are the Messiah, Son of the living God": Matt.

16:15-17 and again in Mark and Luke. Jesus made it a personal observation and belief.

One of the challenges in reading and praying this prayer is to make it personal, to apply it to each of our lives, to avoid focusing on "the Church" while forgetting the demands to which each of us is called in living out a life of discipleship. As Pastor Dana reminds us each week, each of us is called to be the Church in our daily lives--in our homes, community, schools, workplaces--even unto the ends of the earth. This month you are invited to pray this prayer and to consider each phrase and each challenge as it applies to you. In what ways do you need God's help to avoid "cowardly surrender to the world"?

In the United Methodist Book of Worship is a section titled "For The Church". Following is one of those prayers, #506:

O God, you have built your Church
upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets,
Jesus Christ himself being the chief cornerstone.
Save the community of your people
from cowardly surrender to the world,
from rendering unto Caesar what belongs to you,
and from forgetting the eternal gospel
amid the temporal pressures of our troubled days.
For the unity of the Church we pray,
and for fellowship across the embittered lines of race and
nation;
to growth in grace, building in love, enlargement in service,
increase in wisdom, faith, charity, and power,
we dedicate our lives;
through Jesus Christ our Savior. Amen.

FINANCIAL INFORMATION 2011 Summary Financial Report

Because we were in the process of finding a new Financial Administrator, our December 31, 2011 financial statements are not quite finalized. The following rounded amounts, however, should not change significantly.

We finished the year with Total Income of \$410,000 and Total Expenses of \$400,000. These expenses do not, however, include \$13,000 we took from the Council Fund to complete our 2011 Apportionments obligation. Had we run the \$13,000 through our Operating Expenses, we would have shown a Net Loss of about \$3,000.

Our General Fund has a balance at December 31 of \$185,000, which is quite healthy for a church our size. The mortgage on our sanctuary has been reduced to \$78,000.

Council has approved a 2012 budget that shows a \$20,000 deficit, with the understanding that we will need to find that amount of money somewhere during the year to meet all the expenses in the budget...which include 100% of our 2012 Apportionments. MDO finished the calendar year with Total Income of \$257,000 and Total Expenses of \$251,000.
